Caring for Your Furniture

At Willis & Gambier, our furniture is crafted from high-quality, carefully selected timbers and veneers. With meticulous machining, skilled hand assembly, and top-quality finishing, you receive a piece of furniture to be proud of. To ensure the longevity and beauty of your furniture, it is essential to give it a little care and attention.

Lacquered Furniture

- Dust frequently with a cloth designed to attract dust rather than scatter it.
- For dining tables, leave them extended for the first few months to avoid uneven shading.
- Regularly move any objects on the surface, such as lamps, bowls, or vases, to prevent shading.
- Immediately blot up any spillages to prevent damage.
- Use quality table mats and cloths to protect surfaces from marking, especially when placing items with rubber feet.
- Always use a protective mat when writing on your furniture to prevent surface marking.
- While our furniture is designed to withstand most temperatures in the modern home, it should be placed away from radiators, direct sunlight, and other heat sources.
- Avoid extreme humidity, as it can cause warping and loosen glues. Keep furniture away from air conditioning units.
- Small tables should not be used for sitting or standing.
- Level your furniture when placing it to ensure doors are aligned and to avoid undue pressure on joints.

Fabric Furniture

- Vacuum your fabric regularly using a low setting with a soft brush, as accumulated dirt can accelerate wear.
- Avoid sharp objects that may snag the fabric or scratch the surface.

- Keep all fabric out of direct sunlight to prevent fading.
- For any doubts, consult a specialist dry cleaner. Treat all stains and spillages immediately. Always test cleaning methods in a small, non-visible area first.
- Soak up spills with an absorbent cloth using a blotting action, working from the edge of the stain inward to avoid spreading.
- Avoid using abrasive cloths or rubbing excessively.
- For water-based stains (e.g., ketchup, soft drinks, wine), use a reputable upholstery shampoo. Apply sparingly with a clean, absorbent cloth, working from the outside of the stain inward. Rinse with warm water.
- For oil-based stains (e.g., salad dressings, butter), use a spot remover containing only cleaning fluid. Dab the stain from the outer edge towards the center. Do not soak the fabric.

Metal Handles & Fittings

- Do not use metal polish on handles, as they have a protective lacquer to prevent tarnishing.

Handling & Movement

- Always seek assistance when moving any piece of furniture, particularly larger items.
- Never drag furniture—always lift it.
- When moving dining tables, always lift by the apron, not by the tabletop, to avoid damaging the extension mechanism.

Furniture Tipping restraint.

Children and adults maybe injured if furniture topples over. ***The tipping restraint must be used for safety reasons.***

When fitted correctly, the restraint would provide protection against furniture unexpectedly falling forward as a result of being bumped, a small tremor or being leaned upon. Where the furniture is positioned against a partition wall the restraint must be fixed to a wall stud.

Warning: This product is only a safe guard and not a substitute for adult supervision.

Installation Instructions:

1. Decide on the final position of the furniture unit against the wall. Attach one bracket centrally at the rear of the unit using the short screws provided. Please see diagram 1.

Note: The fittings for the wall attachment are not included. Suitable items need to be sourced by the end user.

If there is a gap the metal plates may not touch but as long as the cable tie goes through each plate that will suffice.

2. Fix the wall attachment bracket using suitable fixings. Please see diagram 1.

Note: Before drilling, check for hidden pipes and cables in the wall in order to avoid them.

3. Position the unit and join the brackets using the cable tie provided. Please see diagram 2.
